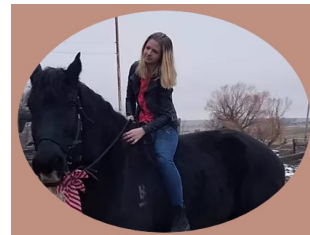

From auction to everyone's favorite — Meet Tiny!

Tiny is a beautiful, 18.2hh Belgian gelding who came to us in February of 2018.

He found himself at a Montana auction, after having worked most of his life as a carriage horse. But he was overworked and when he could not “perform” anymore, he was of no value to the owners anymore so he was sold to a guest ranch, but they quickly realized that it would take too much effort for Tiny to heal so they sent him to auction.

That was Tiny's lucky day, because 1H@AT was there to save him and bring him to the rescue. Tiny had a stifle injury, he was in pain and he was thin. He was laying down for hours at a time, but he had all the time in the world to recover at the rescue – and he did!

He is close to 20 years old by now and as so often with older horses, he is hard to keep weight on. He is on 24/7 free feed hay and the summer pastures are always great for him! Tiny gets 16 pounds of grain a day to maintain his weight.

He has become the rescue's ambassador and goes to events with us, where he always draws the crowd because of his size and his quiet demeanor. He is a gentle giant for sure!

Tiny has also started to visit senior homes and bring smiles to senior residents! This is our way of saying THANK YOU to the community for all your support!

Bill is a beautiful 19 hh Belgian gelding. He came to us from a Kansas kill pen extremely thin for his size, weighing in at only 1455 pounds.

Bill needed a fist size salivary gland rock removed from his cheek and also had a badly infected eye, so his third eyelid was removed.

He was extremely scared of the human touch and it took him a while before he allowed anyone near him. We can only imagine what Bill had been through in his past!

He recovered well at the rescue after his surgeries and gained weight beautifully. By August Bill had gained a few hundred pounds and topped the scale at 1730! Needless to say, he loved his food and especially the lush green grass in the pasture!

Bill found his forever home in October of 2019 together with his friend Lilli, a Belgian mare, and they are both thriving with their adoptive family!
